TEXAS EVICTION DIVERSION PROGRAM(TEDP)

BEHIND ON RENT OR UTILITY BILLS?

Texas Rent Relief Will No Longer Accept New Applications After November 5th

The Texas Eviction Diversion Program (TEDP) is through the Texas Rent Relief Program is Here to Help! It forms a unique partnership to help eligible tenants stay in their homes and provide landlords with an alternative to eviction.

TEDP uses a special court process that allows courts to put eviction lawsuits on hold and divert them to the TEDP. Both tenant and landlord must agree to participate and meet the program requirements. Lump sum payments are made to landlords in exchange for allowing tenants to remain in their homes. This is funded through a set-aside of the Texas Rent Relief Program and will remain available until funds are expended. Justices of the Peace refer applicants to apply for assistance through TDHCA at [TexasRentRelief.com](https://www.texasrentrelief.com) or **1-833-989-7368**. TEDP may provide up to 15 months of rental and utility assistance for eligible tenants who are behind due to COVID-19 pandemic and have been sued for eviction.

The website will provide additional information as well the eligibility requirements and how to apply.

Renter's Insurance

As a resident of Public Housing, you may want to consider purchasing Renters Insurance.

Renters insurance covers a policyholder's belongings against perils such as fire, theft/ vandalism, flood/water damage, windstorm, hail etc. It provides personal liability coverage for damage the policy holder or dependents cause to third parties. It also provides additional living expenses, known as loss of use coverage if a policy holder must move while his or her dwelling is repaired. It can include coverage for their replacement cost or actual cash value that includes depreciation. 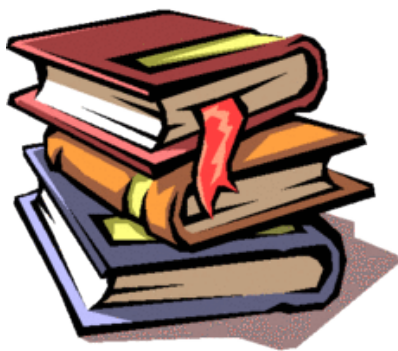
Money Follows the Person (MFP) Program

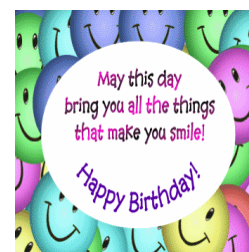
